Palm Sunday of The Lord's Passion

There is a core similarity between the four accounts of the death of Jesus in the New Testament. However, they differ in sequence and in details, allowing various understandings of the cross to unfold. Because the death of Jesus was and is such a deeply mysterious and indeed perplexing event, different dimensions are explored and laid bare by different New Testament writers, Matthew, Luke and John all bring forward somehow the resurrection into the story of Jesus' death. None is more dramatic than Matthew, who introduces not one but two earthquakes at this point.

Divine Mercy Sunday: Will be celebrated in St. Macartan's Cathedral Sunday 17th April at 3pm. The celebration will consist of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction; Recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet and the Rosary and Veneration of the Divine Mercy image and a relic of St. Faustina. A number of priests will be available for individual confession.

Cemetery Sunday: The annual blessing of the graves will take place after Masses on Sunday 9th July in the Immaculate Conception and St Patrick's, and on Sunday 16th July after 10am Mass in the Sacred Heart.

The Easter Triduum:

During the sacred Triduum (the word comes from the Latin "three days), we celebrate the heart of our faith – the death, burial and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Holy Thursday: On this morning in cathedrals around the world, priests and people gather with their bishop for the Mass of the Oils (also called the Chrism Mass). The oils of Baptism and of the Sick are blessed and the oil of Chrism is blessed and consecrated at this Mass.

On this evening, the Mass of the Lord's Supper is celebrated. Here, we call to mind what Jesus did at the Last Supper. His call to service is enacted in the washing of his disciples feet and he gave himself to them in his gift of the Eucharist, calling his followers to share in his mission; to do what he had done.

Good Friday: The celebration of the suffering and death of Jesus. This is the most solemn day in the Church year. The liturgy is in three parts:

- Liturgy of the Word
- Veneration of the Cross
- Holy Communion (the Eucharist is not celebrated today, so we receive the sacred host which has been consecrated at the Mass of the Lord's Supper)

Holy Saturday: At the Easter Vigil we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus; the pain of Good Friday gives way to the glory of the risen Christ.

- Service of Light the Easter fire is lit and blessed and from it we light the Paschal Candle
- Liturgy of the Word we listen to the story of our salvation
- Liturgy of Baptism we recall our own baptism, we renew our baptismal promises
- Liturgy of the Eucharist in which we are fully united to Christ by sharing in his body and blood
