There also is a charity shelter founded on the farmstead of the Convent for people who were led astray by the rough and tumble of life (the homeless, drug or alcohol addicts, ex-prisoners and the less able). Over 200 residents live here today. A rehabilitation facility for females was established several years ago for female exprisoners, the homeless and the mentally challenged women. Sisters Larisa and Veronica will visit our parish where they will set up a small stall of beautiful icons and souvenirs made in the convent workshops, at St Patrick's Church on 21st May at 7pm and the 22nd of May at 10am to raise funds to support and develop the above ministries.
